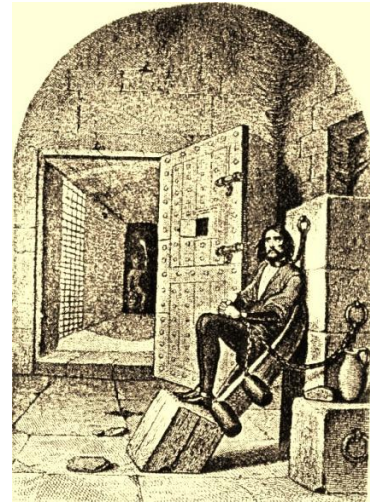


## Heritage Week 2012 special event!

As part of Heritage Week 2012, join us for *Inside Stories: Tales from Both Sides of the Bars*, a full day of celebration of the heritage of Fredericton's **Old York County Jail**. Recent historical enhancements to the building (made possible by the Community Museums Program of the Department of Wellness, Culture and Sport - Heritage Branch) will be revealed for the first time, highlighting the fascinating story of this unique and infamous Fredericton building. This event marks the Old York County Jail's formal place as a part of the story of New Brunswick.

Enjoy a full day of guided tours, demonstrations and refreshments as we unveil the little known stories and legends of the people, places and events that define this austere and powerful architectural treasure in the heart of Fredericton. Five new hands-on science exhibits in the museum will demonstrate how scientific knowledge of DNA was used to advance crime forensics and gather legal evidence.

From its beginning in 1842 as a rough colonial-era prison of beggars, thieves and unfortunates, to its evolution into a modern provincial jail and its subsequent redevelopment into the province's only science centre —the Jail and its chosen occupants illustrate the changes in the social, cultural and economic fabric of New Brunswick over the years.



*The history of the Old York County Jail is part of our collective story as a province. The **Inside Stories: Tales from Both Sides of the Bars** event will welcome current and retired **police officers, lawyers, judges, legal and crime professionals and the general public** to share and reminisce about their individual experience of the Jail and learn about its heritage.
